MOLINE CITY COUNCIL MEETING

City Hall, 619 16th Street
Tuesday, May 28, 2013

Council Meeting: The City Council meeting came to order at 6:38 p.m. The Council met in regular session in the Council Chambers at City Hall.

Pledge: The Council and audience recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll Call: Roll call was taken with Mayor Raes, Aldermen Knaack, Parker, Brown, Turner, Schoonmaker, Liddell and Acri present. Absent: None.

Second Reading Ordinances

1. Council Bill/General Ordinance 3011-2013

An Ordinance amending Chapter 20 "MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC," of the Moline Code of Ordinances, Section 20-4205, "ALTERED SPEED LIMITS," Appendix 35, "40 MPH SPEED LIMIT," by including northbound and southbound Nineteenth Street, from Seventh Avenue to Avenue of the Cities.

2. Council Bill/General Ordinance 3012-2013

An Ordinance amending Chapter 20, "MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC," of the Moline Code of Ordinances, Section 20-5124, "UNAUTHORIZED PERSONS USING PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES PARKING SPACES; A VIOLATION," Appendix 24, "PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES PARKING SPACES," by including one on-street stall at 848 - 15th Street.

3. Council Bill/Special Ordinance 4020-2013

A Special Ordinance approving the approval of a Jurisdictional Transfer with the Illinois Department of Transportation to accept jurisdiction of 41st Drive Connector and 41st Avenue Drive.

Resolutions

4. Council Bill/Resolution 1084-2013

A Resolution accepting the actuarial valuation report submitted by MWM Consulting Group for the year beginning January 1, 2012 and ending December 31, 2012 for the City of Moline's Other Post Employment Benefits Under GASB#45.

5. Council Bill/Resolution 1085-2013

A Resolution approving a request from the Civic Center Authority for payment of capital improvements in the amount of \$911,606.00 from the Capital Improvement Project Reserve Account (CIPRA) as established per the Intergovernmental Agreement between the Civic Center Authority and the City of Moline.

Omnibus Vote: Alderman Knaack, seconded by Alderman Liddell, moved to approve and adopt, by omnibus vote, these items. Motion carried on roll call with the following vote: ayes: Aldermen Knaack, Parker, Brown, Turner, Schoonmaker, Liddell and Acri; nays: none.

Items Not on Consent:

Second Reading Ordinances

6. Council Bill/General Ordinance 3013-2013

An Ordinance amending Chapter 24, "PERSONNEL," of the Moline Code of Ordinances, Section 24-2203(b), "Residency Required," by repealing said section in its entirety and enacting in lieu thereof one new Section 24-2203(b).

Adopted: Alderman Knaack, seconded by Alderman Liddell, moved to adopt Council Bill 3013-2013. Alderman Acri motioned to amend Council Bill 3013-2013 by requiring the salary of Department Directors that do not live within the City of Moline, to be lowered. Motion to amend failed for lack of a second. Motion to adopt carried on roll call with the following vote: ayes: Aldermen Knaack, Parker, Brown, Turner, Schoonmaker and Liddell; nays: Alderman Acri.

Council, Staff and Citizen Comments:

Michael P. Waldron, Public Works Director, stated that approximately 3.65" of rain fell on Sunday, creating hazardous conditions on roads. The Police Department did a fantastic job assisting motorists whose cars became stalled and stranded in deep water. Sewer processing plants are operating at capacity, and river levels are continuing to rise.

Ray Forsythe, Planning & Development Director, stated that the City has received notification from the US Housing and Urban Development Department of a lead abatement grant. Ninety homes in the City of Moline will be targeted for lead abatement.

David Anderson, 2412 31st Street A, displayed a photo of "Road Closed" signs that had been erected on 29th Street, south of Avenue of the Cities. Mr. Anderson indicated that no work had been done and requested that signage be cleared from the area because it is confusing.

Sharon Lynch, 5111 8th Avenue, submitted the attached documentation encouraging support of changing the City of Moline Code of Ordinances as it pertains to allowing chickens in the City. Alderman Schoonmaker, seconded by Alderman Knaack, made a motion to direct staff to investigate the possibility of allowing for chickens within the City of Moline. Motion passed with Alderman Turner voting nay.

On motion of Alderman Knaack, seconded by Alderman Brown, Council adjourned at 6:55p.m.
